Malibu Woman's Club annually awards a number of senior scholarships to residents of the United States and Malibu, **90265**, or graduating students who attend Malibu High School. We have found that students benefit from recognition by our community for their achievements in scholarship and community service.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic achievement, extracurricular activities, community service, employment experience, references, a personal statement or essay, and a creative multimedia project.

Students must complete and mail their entire application including essays, transcripts, and three references postmarked on or before Friday, February 18, 2022. - 1. Send one application with all of your personal identifiers, including your name and the names of your parents, LEFT BLANK or WHITED OUT, EXCEPT FOR YOUR STUDENT NUMBER. REMEMBER TO ASK YOUR SCHOOL TO WHITE OUT YOUR NAME ON YOUR TRANSCRIPT AND ALL RECOMMENDATIONS.**
- 2. Send a second complete scholarship application with your identifiers showing on all materials.**

CREATE A WATER EDUCATION CAMPAIGN USING YOUR ORIGINAL LOGO FOR IDENTIFICATION

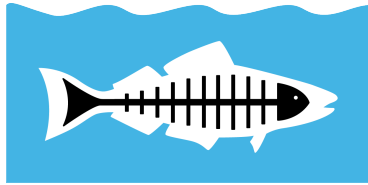
Drought has recently become a major problem for California and the residents of Malibu. The past 12 months were the driest in a century. Lake Mead, one of our most crucial water sources, has dropped to its lowest level ever. And Californians aren't conserving anywhere close to the 15% cutback in water that officials have called for. Governor Newsom just declared a drought emergency for the entire state.

Malibu Woman's Club invites 12th grade students to develop a climate change/water conservation public education campaign. You must teach the public about the problem you've researched and motivate them to do something specific to help solve the problem. We also want you to create a logo that Malibu citizens can recognize as a way to do something helpful.

First, choose one aspect of climate change or drought conditions that interests you and **research the topic thoroughly**. Some examples might be drought, ground water depletion, methods of collecting rain water, desalinization projects, water conservation, how water gets trapped in the atmosphere when we have warmer temperatures, grey water systems, water systems, how fire retardant affects our water supply, drought tolerant planting, waste water treatment, water tables, ocean warming, wildfires, carbon emissions, or any other topic about climate change or drought that fascinates you. Gather your campaign ideas: What do you want to teach the public and what will you encourage them to do?

Second, choose your medium. You may use any method to communicate your idea: Write an essay (1-2 typewritten pages), poem, play, letter to the editor of a newspaper, story, cartoon, design a poster, Public Service Announcement video with a time limit of one minute, board game, T shirt, music, interpretive dance, coloring book, sculpture, flag, claymation, photography or any other form of artistic expression that is most comfortable for you. If you cannot obtain poster board for your campaign, please inform your teacher.

Third, create a logo representative of your education campaign and embed it in your presentation. Your logo must be easily identifiable with your education campaign. Many organizations have a logo as a visual way of identifying their cause. For instance, Heal the Bay, the California Coastal Commission, and the Red Cross all have logos that easily tell their ideas:



Remember, you must persuade your audience to actually **do something** to prevent climate change or drought conditions from becoming worse. Using the honor system, all work must be done by students without adult assistance.

Submit Part VIII via <https://wettransfer.com/> or <https://googledocs.com/>. Both transfer large files free. **LABEL entry with your initials and student #.**

To use We Transfer, type in your email to receive a 6-digit verification code. To send your file, type in charlotte@charlotteward.org. Either drag and drop the submission up to 2 GB, or use the plus sign in the upper left to open a file window and select the file you want to share. We Transfer will send a 6-digit verification code to the source email; enter that code to start the upload. When complete, you will receive an email verifying that your file has been successfully sent to me. You will receive a third email when I have successfully downloaded your submission.

Google Docs uploads a source file for you and then sends you a link to download the file from its drive. Google docs sends the link and file to me at charlotte@charlotteward.org. I can download your entry for judging.
